Dear Nevada PVA Members and Friends,

As we embrace the spirit of giving this December, we are excited to share some wonderful updates and events within our community.

Recently, NV PVA member Roland Teal reached out for assistance in having his American Flag, a tribute to his service retirement, and his PVA flag flown. We want to extend our gratitude to Nat for researching this project and successfully procuring the PVA flag. Special thanks also go to Karl and his church group for completing the project and honoring Roland in this meaningful way.

Our appreciation continues with the dedicated volunteers from the Southwest Gas Foundation who generously spent their Saturday assembling hygiene kits for our local veterans. Thanks to their efforts and a generous grant from their foundation, we were able to create 1,000 hygiene kits. It was a privilege to spend the morning alongside 130 wonderful volunteers who showed their commitment to serving those who have served us.

This year we also delivered 30 turkeys directly to Nevada PVA members' homes, sent out 8 gift cards to members residing in rural or Northern Nevada, and distributed food and hygiene kits to 180 veterans in need across our community.

Looking ahead, here are some important events to mark on your calendar.

- ♦ **December 14**: Our annual holiday party will take place from 12 pm to 2 pm. If you would like to attend, please call the office at 702/646-0040 to RSVP.
- **December 17**: NV Energy employees will gather to create 200 bags of household cleaning supplies and backpacks filled with goodies for our veterans and 25 families with special needs children.
- ♦ **December 18**: We'll be delivering food, hygiene kits, household cleaning supplies, and backpacks to 175 veterans' homes. Additionally, we invite our members to the Paralympic kids' sports activity night and holiday party at JD Smith Middle School from 5 pm to 7 pm, where we will serve a spaghetti dinner, distribute toys, and provide food bags for families.

Changes to AAE Grant

Effective October 1, 2024 the VA has made changes to how they pay out the Adaptive Equipment portion of the Auto Grant process. Adaptive equipment means equipment which must be part of or added to a conveyance manufactured for sale to the general public to make it safe for use by the Veteran and enable that Veteran and the conveyance to meet applicable standards of licensure. In the past the VA paid 100% of the cost for any adaptions that are necessary for the vehicle. Now the VA has implemented an AAE payment schedule. This list contains the maximum allowable reimbursement amounts for such things as specific adaptions parts, hourly labor rates, repairs and much more. For some insight as to those costs you can visit https://www.prosthetics.va.gov/psas/AAE_Schedule.asp. What does this mean for you the Veteran? This means that if the dealership you are working with decides to charge higher prices then what the VA is allowed to pay, then you will be responsible for the difference. I have contacted the Chief of Prosthetics in both Las Vegas and Reno and they both held conferences with the major adaptive dealerships in our area and each dealership has stated that they plan to stay within the AAE Schedule. Please contact your local PVA Service Officer if you have any questions.

2024 VA Ancillary Benefits Increased and VA Disability Compensation Rates

Effective October 1, 2024 the rates have increased for the Department of Veteran's Affair ancillary benefits. In order to be eligible for one or more of the ancillary benefits you must have a qualifying service-connected disability. The new fiscal year 2025 amounts are listed below.

Specially Adaptive Housing (SAH) Grant: \$121,812.00 Special Housing Adaptation (SHA) Grant: \$24,405.00

SAH Temporary Residence Adaptation (TRA) Grant: \$49,062.00 SHA Temporary Residence Adaptation (TRA) Grant: \$8,760.00

Auto and Adaptive Equipment Grant: \$26,417.20 Clothing Allowance: Not updated at this time. Medal of Honor pension: Not updated at this time.




